This four day course provides mitigation planners and risk analysts with the skills to use GIS tools, with emphasis on Hazus, to create and update flood, hurricane, and earthquake components of a community risk assessment.

A combination of individual as well as group activities lead the class through the step-by-step process of conducting a risk assessment including hazard identification, profiling of hazards, development asset inventories, estimating loss, and prioritizing mitigation options.
